1. ANNOUNCEMENT

The Otway Enduro Club, here after called the Promoter will conduct the Mule Express (Round 3 of the Stampede Pony Express Series) at the Riordan Property in Barwon Downs, on November 19 2023.

2. JURISDICTION

- 2.1 The abovementioned Event has been authorised by Motorcycling Victoria which has issued the Motorcycling Australia Permit Number TBC and is open to holders of current Motorcycling Australia Senior & Junior Racing Licences.
- 2.2 The meeting will be held in accordance with the current General Competition Rules (GCRs), these Supplementary Regulations, MA policies, and any final instructions approved by Motorcycling Victoria. By entering this meeting all parties agree to comply with such rules, regulations, by-laws and instructions.

5. ENTRY FEE

- 5.1 Senior \$100, Junior \$60.
- 5.2 Payment by Credit Card or PayPal through Ridernet online entry form.
- 5.3 Entries will be accepted only for current MA Senior National (SNA) and MA Junior National (JNA) competition licence holders. Current competition licence and current club membership card must be produced at sign in if requested. **NO EXCEPTIONS**

6. ENTRY PASSES

One rider pass is supplied to each rider entrant. Spectators are able to enter for FREE.



7. INSURANCE

- 7.1 Those who hold an MA licence current for the duration of the Event, and officials, who are signed on for the Event are covered by MA's National Personal Accident Scheme which provides basic cover for rehabilitation expenses and death and permanent disability benefits. For more information see Insurance - Motorcycling Australia (ma.org.au)
- 7.2 Ambulance Insurance is compulsory for licensees.
It is strongly recommended that competitors consider taking out weekly benefits insurance.

8. MEDICAL SERVICES

Scott Preschell ((Event First Aid and Fire Services) – 0419363752

First Aid and Fire Services will be on-site Sunday. There will be four First Aid qualified people on-site. A First Aid Medical Station Trailer, fire truck ATV with Rescue Trailer, fire fighting equipment and a Honda CRF450 Quick Response Bike will all be on-site at the event from early Sunday till the last rider has completed the race on Sunday.

9. SCRUTINEERING

- 9.1 Self-Scrutineering will be in place for the Mule Express, however we will have a scrutineer on site to selectively scrutineer motorbikes after registrations. The self-scrutineering form will be available for download with the Final Instructions. Please fill the form out, print and bring with you to registration for presentation. Juniors registration begins at 7.15am and conclude at 8.00am and Seniors at 10.30am and conclude at 11.45am.
Please do not abuse the responsibility of doing your own self-scrutineering. If your motorbike is found to not adhere to the scrutineering rules you will have the opportunity to rectify the issue before the race starts. If the issue can not be repaired to meet the scrutineers approval you will be disqualified and forfeit any right for a refund.
- 9.2 Machines entered in the competition must have successfully passed a machine examination prior to taking part in practice, qualifying or racing. An MA decal will be placed on the front number plate to indicate that it has been successfully examined.
- 9.3 Current competition licences and full riding gear must be presented at scrutineering. Eligibility checks can take place at any time during the meeting. Machines which suffer accident damage in practice or race sessions must be re-examined before participating again.
- 9.4 In addition to supervising the pulling down and checking of machines after official protests have been received by the Clerk of Course in accordance with the GCRs, the Steward can order that any machine be measured and if this occurs the Scrutineer will supervise a team member to pull down any machine that has taken part in the event. Failure to comply with this regulation will result in this matter being referred to the Clerk of Course for further action.
- 9.5 Machines will not be sealed for later checking after the event. All machines that are to be pulled down and scrutineered will take place at the circuit before the machine is released by the Scrutineer. A member of the rider's team must be always available to carry out the strip down under the control of the Scrutineer. Failure to comply with this regulation will result in this matter being referred to the Clerk of Course for further action.

11. ENTRIES TO CONSTITUTE A CLASS

11.1 To constitute a class for the purpose of gaining points in the series, the number of contestants entered and competing in each class shall be: at least six eg. a team of two riders is considered one.

For the purpose of receiving trophies for Mule Express race there will be no limit on the numbers in each event.

11.2 Should there be insufficient entries in any class of competition, the decision to run or cancel the class, or to combine events and re-distribute any awards and/or prize money, will be at the discretion of the Promoter, subject to the prior express approval of the RCB.

12. STARTS AND FINISHES

Junior Race (1.5 hours)

65cc, 85cc and 125/250cc Classes will all compete at the same time on the same track.

Starting Procedure:

125/250cc Class to start the race together in a mass start

85cc Class to leave 30 seconds after the 125/250cc Class

65cc Class to leave 30 seconds after the 85cc Class

Race timing starts when the 125/250cc Class riders leave.

Race Conclusion Procedure:

You have 1.5 hours to complete as many laps as you can, if you pass through the Start/Finish line with 1 hour 29 minutes on the clock you must complete another lap. If you don't want to do another lap then wait until the race clock hits 1 hour 30 minutes, then proceed past the Start/Finish line when the checkered flag is out.

Senior Race (4 hours in total)

All classes to ride the same track starting in the following order in groups of 10 at 30 second intervals.

Starting Procedure:

Ironman 16 to 34 years

Ironman 35 + years

Combined age 32 - 49 years

Combined age 50 - 64 years

Combined age 65 - 79 years

Combined age 80 + years

Womens (4 hour Ironperson race)

Parent & Child (Child must be 16 years old)

Race timing starts when the first group of Ironman 16 to 34 year riders leave the starting gate.

Race Conclusion Procedure:

You have 4 hours to complete as many laps as you can, if you pass through the Start/Finish line with 3 hours 59 minutes on the clock you must complete another lap. If you don't want to do another lap then wait until the race clock hits 4 hours then proceed past the Start/Finish line when the checkered flag is out.

13. FLAGS AND SIGNALS

Green Flag When waved, course is clear.

Yellow Flag Held stationary, danger ride slowly, overtaking is forbidden

Yellow Flag Waved, immediate danger, slow down, prepare to stop, overtaking forbidden

White Flag Waved, slow moving intervention vehicle on track

Black & White Chequered Flag waved – Finish of race, practice session or qualifying

14. RACE FORMAT

Ironman & Ironchild Format

Complete as many laps as you can in the allotted race time.

Team Format

Teams of two riders can be entered using separate bikes for each rider or the one bike for both riders. Teams can choose to swap riders at the end of each lap or after two, three or four laps. If one member of the team is injured the second member of the team can continue the race by themselves as long as the injured rider can make it back to the pits for a successful change over.

19. MACHINES AND RIDERS

- 19.1 All machines entered must comply with the current GCRs for Enduro competition.
- 19.2 A team event can use one motorbike for both riders, as long as they start the race with this set-up.
- 19.3 The motorbike you start the event must be the motorbike you finish with, you cannot substitute another motorbike under any circumstance. Within a team if a rider's motorbike breaks down their partner can finish the race solely on his/her bike, the person who's motorbike broke down cannot ride his/her partners motorbike.

20. RIDING NUMBERS

Otway Enduro Club will supply each rider with numbers for their motorbike which will need to be adhered to the bike before the commencement of the race.

21. RIDERS' BRIEFING

A riders' briefing will be held prior to the commencement of racing, which ALL competitors MUST attend. Details will be included in the final instructions.

22. CIRCUIT DESCRIPTION

Junior Track

The junior track is a cross country circuit of 6.5 kms in length consisting mostly of single trail through bush land and plantations. The track is undulating with many steep hills, logs and some man made obstacles. There will be a number of 'rooster' and 'chicken' lines for competitors to choose to ride. The rooster line will be more difficult with a 'risk/reward' element. Ride the rooster lines cleanly and you'll gain a distinct time advantage over the chicken line.

Senior Track

The senior track is a cross country circuit of 13.5 kms in length. The track is mostly single trail through bush land and plantations. The track is undulating with many steep hills, logs and some man made obstacles. There will be a number of 'rooster' and 'chicken' lines for competitors to choose to ride. The rooster line will be more difficult with a 'risk/reward' element. Ride the rooster lines cleanly and you'll gain a distinct time advantage over the chicken line.

23. PIT RULES

Refueling bikes

Refueling in the pits is allowed only on an enviro mat and within reach of a 2kg fire extinguisher. If you don't have an enviro mat you will need to refuel at the designated refueling area set up within the pits.

Riding Speed in the Pits

All bikes ridden through the pits need to do so at walking pace 5km/h, if a bike exceeds this speed then a penalty of 5 minutes will be added to their time. If you as a rider witnesses a motorbike exceeding this speed please write down the rider's number and notify a marshal. The marshal will bring this infraction to the attention of the Clerk of the Course and Steward.

24. TRACK CUTTING AND PENALTIES

All care will be taken to bunt the course appropriately as to make it easy for riders to follow. It is the riders responsibility to follow the track to the integrity of the design. Is it acceptable for a rider to find a new line on a steep hill to ride around stuck riders, unless the new line is substantially easy than the intended line of the track. The line of a track is considered to be within a five metre range either side of the original track line.

If a rider is found to have cut the track, deliberately ridden through or over bunting when there is a clear track line in place a penalty of 10 minutes will be added to their lap time. Marshals will be in place at known sections of this track where there is potential for track cutting, bike numbers will taken and penalties will be issued by the Clerk of Course and Steward. CHEATING IS NOT ACCEPTABLE

25. TRACK INSPECTION

All competitors will be given the opportunity to walk and inspect the track prior to any on-track participation. This inspection must be done on foot and competitors are reminded that service vehicles may be in operation on the circuit at this time.

25.1 Track Dissatisfaction

Competitors who are not satisfied with any aspects of the track can present these concerns to the Clerk of Course. If those concerns cannot be resolved, the competitor will be invited to withdraw from the meeting.

26. FACILITIES

26.1 Food/Drinks

The club is providing a canteen which will be serving, egg and bacon burgers for breakfast, burgers for lunch as well as cakes etc. Water, soft-drink, energy drinks and coffee will also be available on site and served by an award winning barista.

Portable toilets will be available around the site.

Mobile Reception, there is poor reception in the valley, the reception improves on the ridge with 4G reception available for Telstra customers.

27. NOISE

Enduro Event Noise Restriction is 112Db.

Noise testing may take place at any time at the discretion of the Chief Scrutineer or the Clerk of Course.

28. ANTI-DOPING POLICY

28.1 All competitors and officials are advised that drug testing may take place in accordance with MA's Anti-Doping Policy, as carried out by the Australian Sports Anti-Doping Authority. Refer to MA website for details.

28.2 If any doubts exist over banned substances it is recommended competitors contact the Drugs in Sport Hotline, ph: 1800 020 506. When drug testing takes place, the payment of prize money may be delayed at [Insert RCB] discretion until the results of the tests are known.

29. DRUG AND ALCOHOL TESTING

All competitors and officials are advised that random drug and alcohol testing may take place during the competition. Refer to MA website for details on the Safety Policy – Drug and Alcohol testing.

For the purposes of drug and alcohol testing, the commencement of the meeting will be deemed to be 8.15am of each day of competition, with the completion of the meeting for the participant being when the participant has vacated the venue.

30. CODES OF BEHAVIOUR

All competitors, officials and parents are reminded of MA's zero tolerance of poor behaviour, either on or off track. The codification of the behaviours expected of MA members and all who attend or participate in motorcycling is contained within MA's policies, including its Member Welfare Policy and its Social Media Policy, which can be found at Policies - Motorcycling Australia (ma.org.au).

31. FIRE EXTINGUISHERS

All riders should have a minimum 2kg, dry powder A:B (E) class, working fire extinguisher in their pit area

32. ADMISSION CHARGES

Admission is FREE for this event for spectators. Camping is based on \$10 per head for people 16 years and older and children are free. Booking for camping needed to be completed with the rider entry form.

33. DISCIPLINE SPECIFIC INFORMATION

This is an enduro event which is considered more difficult than a regular enduro that's why it's called a Mule Express, expect to ride up and down steep hills, over logs, rocks, and man made obstacles. Marshalls are instructed not to offer help unless there is a danger of rider injury. Riders can help each other over obstacles and up and down hill.

34. CANCELLATION POLICY

Otway Enduro Club reserves the right to evict any participant at any stage of the event for non-compliance of these terms, or for non-compliance of any instructions given throughout the event. Under such circumstances, no refund of any fees will be made.

Otway Enduro Club reserves the right to postpone, terminate or cancel the event without notice to the participant. Any refund of entry fees will be made at the discretion of Otway Enduro Club. The participant agrees to make no claim for damages or consequential loss if any of the conditions listed in these terms and conditions are applied by the Otway Enduro Club, it's committee, agents or contractors.

35. REFUND POLICY

Any rider requesting a refund must be received in writing via email (send to info@otwayenduroclub.org) Your withdrawal request will become effective on the date the notice is received by the Otway Enduro Club.

The following cancellation terms apply:

- If you withdraw more than 14 days prior to the event date a full refund will be supplied minus a \$20 administration fee.
- If you cancel between 14 and 7 days prior to the event, a 50% refund will be given minus a \$20 administration fee.
- If you cancel within 7 days prior to the event, NO refund will be given.

Exceptional circumstances may qualify for a full refund for rider withdrawal within 14 days of the event commencing, these include:

- Major injury which prevents you from riding
- Death in the family
- Positive Covid test

Any other reasons will be left at the discretion of the Otway Enduro Club Committee.



CONTRACT TO PARTICIPATE IN THE BLACK BEAUTY SPRINTS

IMPORTANT - THIS IS A CONTRACT. YOU MUST READ AND SIGN THIS CONTRACT BEFORE YOU PARTICIPATE.

Waiver Agreement

RECITALS

- A. The Provider organises, and permits participants to participate in, the Recreational Activity in consideration for the Participant:
- If a rider, paying the Application Fee; and
 - If a volunteer official volunteering to officiate at the Recreational Activity;
 - If a member of the media, accepting the Provider's terms of media accreditation; and
- otherwise agreeing to be bound by the Provider's rules and directives governing the conduct of the Recreational Activity.
- B. This document is the contract between the Provider and the Participant with respect to the Participant's participation in the Recreational Activity.
- C. The purposes of this contract include to:
- exclude the liability of the Provider to the extent permissible by law to pay damages or any other form of compensation whether arising in tort contract or statute or at law or in equity for any personal injury or death of the Participant as a result of the participant's participation in the Recreational Activity; and
 - provide a warning of the risks of engaging in the Recreational Activity (as defined below).
- D. Participating in the Recreational Activity is dangerous. The risks include but are not limited to death, serious injury or illness due to:
- falling from your bike;
 - difficult terrain and obstacles;
 - hazardous and changeable track conditions;
 - rider error and/or lack of skill or care and/or dangerous or reckless behaviour on your part or the part of other participants;
 - undisclosed medical conditions;
 - decisions made or not made by organisers, officials, landowners/track operators and any agents or representatives of those in charge of meetings;
 - heat, cold, wet or other adverse weather conditions;
 - contact with vehicles, other participants or members of the public who may or may not be acting safely;
 - lack of access to medical, evacuation or search services; or
 - design of the track.

OPERATIVE PARTS

- In consideration for me (the Participant) paying or providing the consideration under clause A above to participate in the Recreational Activity, the Provider will permit me to participate in the Recreational Activity.
- I acknowledge that the Recreational Activity involves the risk of serious injury, physical harm or death. I warrant that I am aware that the Recreational Activity involves the risk of serious injury, physical harm or death.



3. I also acknowledge that in signing this contract I have done so voluntarily and that no pressure or unfair tactics have been used to persuade me to sign this contract and that I have done so voluntarily in the knowledge that it is open to me not to sign the contract and for the Provider to refuse to permit me to participate in the Recreational Activity. I also warrant that I have been given sufficient opportunity to read this contract before signing it and that I have read it.
4. I agree that the Provider and any directors or officers of the Provider and any person associated with organising the Recreational Activity shall not be liable to me or any other person for damages, compensation or loss, whether in tort, contract, under statute or at law or in equity or otherwise for any personal injury or death caused by, or in connection with, or arising out of, my participation in the Recreational Activity.

DEFINITIONS

Application Fee means the fee payable by the Participant (as a rider) to participate in the Recreational Activity.

Participant means the person signing this form and whose name appears next to Participant below.

Provider means those persons and entities listed in Annexure 1.

Recreational Activity means the event specified in Annexure 2.

Participant acknowledgements, consents and authorisations

- i. I acknowledge that it is my responsibility to only participate in the Recreational Activity if I am fit and able to do so.
- ii. I acknowledge that I am responsible for all medical, hospital and ambulance expenses arising out of my participation in the Recreational Activity save for any benefits provided by MA's Personal Accident Policy.
- iii. I authorise and consent to the Provider arranging any medical, hospital or ambulance services on my behalf if necessary arising out of my participation in the Recreational Activity.
- iv. I authorise and consent to the Provider collecting and using my personal information for the purpose of administering the Recreational Activity and in accordance with the MA Privacy Policy.
- v. I authorise and consent to the Provider collecting my private health information from me and from any person or entity providing me with medical, hospital or ambulance services arising out of my participation in the Recreational Activities, and to the use of such information to reduce the risks to persons participating in recreational activities, in accordance with the MA Privacy Policy.
- vi. I acknowledge that I have agreed to, and am bound by, the Provider's rules and directives governing the conduct of the Recreational Activity, including the MA anti-doping policy and understand that I may be subject to drug testing.
- vii. I authorise and consent to photographs and electronic images (images) being taken of me in the course of the Recreational Activity. I have no proprietary interest in the images. I authorise and consent to the Provider using such images, my name and information about my participation in the Recreational Activity to promote the Provider or any recreational activities organised by the Provider.

Additional Clauses for Victorian Events

SCHEDULE 3

WARNING UNDER THE AUSTRALIAN CONSUMER LAW AND FAIR TRADING ACT 2012

Under the Australian Consumer Law (Victoria), several statutory guarantees apply to the supply of certain goods and services. These guarantees mean that the supplier named on this form is required to ensure that the recreational services it supplies to you:

- are rendered with due care and skill; and
- are reasonably fit for any purpose which you, either expressly or by implication, make known to the supplier; and
- might reasonably be expected to achieve any result you have made known to the supplier.

Under section 22 of the Australian Consumer Law and Fair Trading Act 2012, the supplier is entitled to ask you to agree that these statutory guarantees do not apply to you. If you sign this form, you will be agreeing that your rights to sue the supplier under the Australian Consumer Law and Fair Trading Act 2012 if you are killed or injured because the services provided were not in accordance with these guarantees, are excluded, restricted or modified in the way set out in this form.

NOTE: The change to your rights, as set out in this form, does not apply if your death or injury is due to gross negligence on the supplier's part. Gross negligence, in relation to an act or omission, means doing the act or omitting to do an act with reckless disregard, with or without consciousness, for the consequences of the act or omission. See regulation 5 of the Australian Consumer Law and Fair Trading Regulations 2012 and section 22(3)(b) of the Australian Consumer Law and Fair Trading Act 2012.

ADDITIONAL CLAUSES FOR SOUTH AUSTRALIAN EVENTS

Form 1 – Recreational services—Exclusion, restriction or modification of rights under the Australian Consumer Law (SA)

Your rights:

Under sections 60 and 61 of the Australian Consumer Law (SA), if a person in trade or commerce supplies you with services (including recreational services¹), there is:

- a statutory guarantee that those services will be rendered with due care and skill; and
- a statutory guarantee that those services, and any product resulting from those services, will be reasonably fit for the purpose for which the services are being acquired (as long as that purpose is made known to the supplier); and
- a statutory guarantee that those services, and any product resulting from those services, will be of such a nature, and quality, state or condition, that they might reasonably be expected to achieve the result that the consumer wishes to achieve (as long as that wish is made known to the supplier or a person with whom negotiations have been conducted in relation to the acquisition of the services).

Excluding, restricting or modifying your rights:

Under section 42 of the Fair Trading Act 1987, the supplier of recreational services is entitled to ask you to agree to exclude, restrict or modify his or her liability for any personal injury suffered by you or another person for whom or on whose behalf you are acquiring the services (a third party consumer).

If you sign this form, you will be agreeing to exclude, restrict or modify the supplier's liability with the result that compensation may not be payable if you or the third party consumer suffer personal injury.



Important

You do not have to agree to exclude, restrict or modify your rights by signing this form. The supplier may refuse to provide you with the services if you do not agree to exclude, restrict or modify your rights by signing this form.

Even if you sign this form, you may still have further legal rights against the supplier. A child under the age of 18 cannot legally agree to exclude, restrict or modify his or her rights. A parent or guardian of a child who acquires recreational services for the child cannot legally agree to exclude, restrict or modify the child's rights.

Agreement to exclude, restrict or modify your rights:

I agree that the liability of the Provider for any personal injury that may result from the supply of the recreational services that may be suffered by me (or a person for whom or on whose behalf I am acquiring the services) is excluded.

Definitions

1. **Recreational services** are services that consist of participation in:
 - a sporting activity or similar leisure-time pursuit; or
 - any other activity that involves a significant degree of physical exertion or risk and is undertaken for the purposes of recreation, enjoyment or leisure.
2. **Personal injury** is bodily injury and includes mental and nervous shock and death.

5. All other persons involved in the organisation, conduct and promotion of the Recreational Activity or construction or location of the facilities used in connection with or otherwise related to the Recreational Activity; and
6. Each of the respective officers, employees, servants, agents, sponsors, successors and assignees of each of the above.
